Southern Regional Championships

For the first time we were overcome by Mother Nature and th"powers that be" who moved our meet date back a week toward winter. Nevertheless we had a fine turnout, more clubs represented than ever and good attendance as well as fine performances . . Space Coast and Boca Raton were real well stocked with swimmers and there were more younger people than sometimes . Awards were made on the basis of events swum Friday and Saturday .

We had a development meet scheduled for relays on the 12th but after calling a number of closer clubs the events scheduked for Sunday were offered instead of our relays. Those who wanted and could make it had the opportunity to post times in the cancelled Sunday events. And a few relays were swum .

St. Pete Masters

We have had a pretty full pool for the past month or two . In anticipation of the Sourhern Regional and the St. Anthonys Tri Athlon both history. At least 23 SPM swimmers took part in the Tri Athlon. We seem to have been rather in the doldrums as to attending meets away. Bill Stinson went down to Mission Bay and Enid and Bill Uhrich went up to Nashville to the Zone Championship meet. About as far away from the center of Dixie Zone as it could be . Don't know of anyone going to North Miami . Stanford and Nationals seems to fare less than heavily from Florida. We will be represented by Steve Grau and George Bole, no George isn't swimming . He does say however that he is available there to anyone from The Florida LMSC who needs his expertise. It will be a big meet with the 'home town' Californians swarming there. It appears that we will have a pretty good group at The Woodlands for Long Course. We should be planning for that now and we should also be thinking of relays. Accomodations could also be under consideration . Note that our next development isn't till May31 . And that will be Long Course . Hurray.

Catie Cooper reports 834 members and encomages Club leaders to get their renewals in as well as any new who need a shove to join the super world of Masters swimming. By the time you read this we'll probably be at 900. Very soon signups will be recorded as new, not renewals.

Chris Carey, still unable to swim after 8 weeks, reiterates Catie's plea to get those foot draggers to renew . Sign up the new recruits. Club officials and meet directors please note that as of June 1.87 All sanctioned meet entries must include an entry time, an actual time or a reasonable time , in order to effect proper seeding . No time , no entry . Also note that swimming will be in the order of oldest to youngest and slowest to fastest. Men and women together if it means fuller heats or saves time. NEW Florida LMSC Inc. Rules. Don't forget

registration #'s .

It is not too early to be thinking of 87-88 meet dates . Your delegates will need them Sept. 1 for Convention and planning ahead will we hope prevent such as this years scheduling of a meet at Missian Bay after the Zone meet had been scheduled in 86 and the scheduleing of Zone LC in North Carolina on the date of the 9th Annual L.C. meet at North Charleston SC. Charelston Masters were not deterred by this and we hope that meet will be well attended .

AN EDITORIAL

In the Southeast it is aparent that Masters Swimming needs, must have new blood in the administration level. Officers, meet directors etc. In its 18th year Masters is seeing an appreciable number of its long time leaders feeling the need to do some other things and pass the jobs on to younger or newer hands. We have plenty of highly capable people. We ahve an increase in the 19-30 age swimmers . We realize these are work and school years but the need isn't for more than a few spurts of activity. A weekend or two and some preparation is all it takes. Representing what I've said before there would be no Masters Swimming if it were not for the competitive swimmers. We do all the work . Masters is not competition alone. Masters is competition, fitness swimmers, triathletes. We need everyone, but we need everyone to cooperate and do a share. Masters is not just being able to dash in to a pool at a convenient time and find a place to swim . Maybe thats the way 60% of our members would like , not that easy .

Every Club needs a strong leader. A decision maker one who gets help when needed. Its not for everyone. But we do have those people. And when we don't have the helpers this happens: No meets in Ft Lauderdale, no meets in North Miami Beach, much less interest in Sarasota, Central Florida, Pensacola. And I was told the Zone Championship held in Arkansas had 25 entries . We need more enthusiasm like Space Coast Masters .

Florida LMSC, Inc. Minutes -- March 28, 1987

The meeting was called to order by President John Maguire at approximately 5:00 p.m. at North Shore Pool. There were approximately 10 representatives present. Previous minutes were approved and seconded.

General Announcements:

- * Present cash balance is \$2,768.58.
- * Catie Cooper announced that there are now 863 registered Masters in the Association. There are 314 new members and 549 renewals.
- * Sanction Fees: The \$10/day bond will be refunded to the team running the meet if they provide the LMSC with meet results within one month after the meet.
- * Separate account will be kept. This money may remain on deposit.

New Business:

- A motion was made to send \$50 to Peter Mullen, Dixie Zone Chairman, to support the Dixie Zone. The motion was made, seconded and approved by the representatives with the stipulation that this year's contribution doesn't commit us to financially support Dixie Zone in the future.
- 2) A motion was made that as of June 1, 1987, all Florida LMSC swimmers submit actual or reasonable times for all sanctioned meets in order to effect fair seeding. The motion was seconded and approved. This proposal will be sent to the National Rules Committee.
- 3) A motion was made to take "Association" out of the Florida name. Henceforth the organization is the Florida LMSC, Inc. The motion was seconded and approved.
- 4) A motion was made that all sanctioned meets will be run slowest to fastest. The motion was seconded and approved by the representatives who also approved submission of this proposal to the National Rules Committee.
- 5) A motion was made that there must be at least one warm up/warm down lane at <u>all</u> sanctioned meets (i.e., if it's a 6 lane pool, only 5 lanes can be used during the meet for events). The motion was seconded and approved by the representatives. Double lane lines should separate this lane.
- 6) A motion was made to make the editor of the LMSC newsletter an officer of the LMSC. The motion was seconded and approved by the representatives. All voting was without dissent.
- 7) A motion was made to increase LMSC dues \$2 to cover costs of sending two men and two women delegates (who must be officers or team representatives of LMSC) to the National convention—thereby minimizing expenditures. The motion was seconded and approved by the representatives contingent on a continued increase in membership. One of the delegates, as a member of either the Rules or Law & Legislation Committee, would be "at large."

NOTE: As of April, 1987, the LSMC is REQUIRING submitted times for all events: no NT can be accepted any longer. The other change is the seeding: all heats will run from slowest to fastest, regardless of age. Relay time trials will be held at the close of Sunday's events for any team desiring a sanctioned time. There is no charge for this, but relays MUST be entered by event # 21, 200 Breast. Five individual events may be entered per day. (Get that trophy!!)

ENTRY PEES: \$ 2.50 per individual event

DEADLINE: Entry Forms, and Fees must be received by JUNE 8 NO DECK ENTRIES Except Relays!!!

HEAT SHEETS and RESULTS: A HEAT SHEET will be furnished to each swimmer. Results may be ordered for \$ 1.00 per copy



CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL

St. Petersburg Masters Regional Meet

At the beautifully appointed North Shore Pool on March 27-28-29, St. Petersburg Masters hosted the Seventeenth Annual Short Course Championships — note that Seventeenth! This is the longest running consecutive meet in the U.S. Masters programs, so Judge Robert Beach informs me — and he should know; he was at number one!!

Unfortunately, our usually dependable weather wasn't. Friday evening, for the 1650, welcomed the competitors and officials with copious quantities of water. But, even with interruptions from lightning, everyone stood fast and we had lift-off. Fifty-four men (ages from 24 to 76 years) and thirty-five ladies (23 to 79 years) set about the long swim. Thirteen men and ten ladies were our representatives for S.P.M., with Laura Kaleel (19m/33.65) our fastest lady and Jim Acker (19m/17.71) the best man. Despite the inclemency of the weather, S.P.M. swimmers managed to return several personal best times. Great credit must be afforded to the officials, timers, guards, and the counters. Judy Humbarger would have been drier if she had swum instead of counting.

Saturday, the 28th, opened with the skies looking apologetic and shame-faced with a shy sun peeping through the racing clouds throughout the day. The first heat of the Ladies 200 Backstroke was a fitting opening for this prestigious meet. Dawn Hewit Braciak gave a delightful exhibition of the dorsal art touching first in 2m 15.05 secs. The 200 backstroke for 24 and under ages had five girls from S.P.M. in the first seven.
