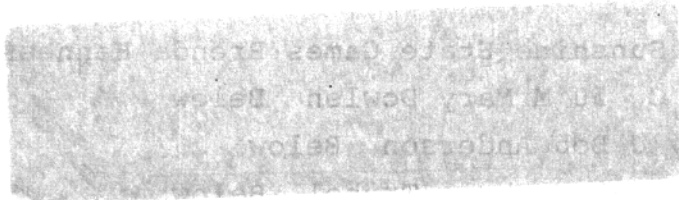

Wayne Reilly reports that besides himself Bev Tucker and Chris Truhol ventured down and over there. They were sure there was a fourth St Pete swimmer but didn't identify him. Since results are not at hand none knew just how they did in the several Pentathlon categories. But he said they did well in the morning but not so well in the afternoon when it turned quite cold.

ORLANDO 25 Meters Meet

On the 11th, 12th and 13th of March 1988, Central Florida Masters provided one of our rare opportunities to compete over the 25 meters distance. Most of the countries outside of the U S A (including Canada) organize their short course competitions in 25 meter pools, and so the USA Masters have few chances to chase World records over this distance.

St Pete Masters, anxious to have names of the World lists were, Beverley Tucker, Mary Barker, Lynn Brownstein and newly claimed Jayne Lambke for the ladies. And Carl Thornburg, Frank Tillotson, Bill Molvie and Jim Acker for the gents Also John Johnston and Bob Beach Bob was the first of the group to change the book, with a very fine paced 800 meters, Clocking 22.55, .06 better than the previous best. Lynn Brownstein, swimming without warmup, was 20 seconds short of the record although she a a best time of 22:15.

Our friends Eenie Jones and her father, Bumpy, had set record trend earlier. Eenie improving the 25/29 time by 36 sec and her father knocked 50 seconds off the existing 800 metres record in his age group.

Next day, the ladies team of Mary Barker, Bev Tucker, Jayne Lambke and Lynn Brownstein fought hard to win a great F/S relay. The 280+ team of Bill Molvie, John Johnston, Frank Tillotson and Carl Thornburg was close to the existing record. On Sunday, Ray Burns, Jayne Lambke, Bill Molvie and Mary Barker rewrote the records for the 200 F/S, 200+ age group. both the F/S and medley relay.

Other World records were performed by Lynn Brownstein 200 metres fly- 5 sec improvement, Ray Burns, 200 metres fly, with a one second improvement. Jayne Lambke was not to be left out when she swam 3:14.06 for a two sec improvement on the current 200 metres I.M. for her age group.

Despite the world records the St Pete group decided that the ANIMAL AWARD for this meet went to Mary Barker, who slashed her own best times in almost every event she had entered. Lynn Brownstein, too, had her best competition times for some time.

At the end of the wee-end, it could be said that everyone who traveled to this swim had something to be pleased about. The close finishes between Carl Thornburg and Frank Tillotson in several events provided excitement for the spectators.

Lets hope we have a big entry for our Spring Classic in April. I know we are going to have really outstanding swimming and I want it to come from St Pete Masters. by george e bole

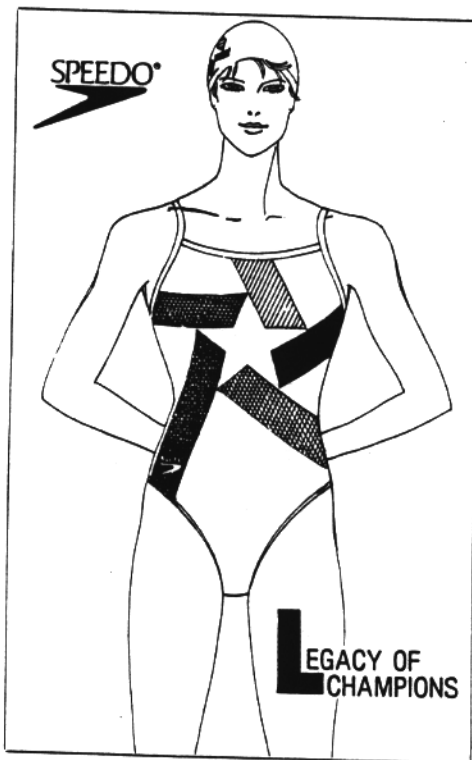
