REMINDER REGARDING MIXED RELAYS:

RULE 101.7.3F (p. 19): Mixed relays shall consist of two men and two women who may swim in any order. It is, therefore, illegal to swim these relays in a 3:1 ratio (that is, 3 men and 1 woman or 3 women and 1 man).

The Pan-Pacific meet at Hamilton, NZ was early April . . . seems a long time ago. Except for the fact that the Home Country New Zelanders, didn't support the meet, it was an excellent one. Only some 700 entries, of which about 300 were from Japan. Negatively, the pool is a little shallow for some of the "hot" swimmers, otherwise it was a well run, very graciously hosted meet. There were about 7 World LCM records set. They were announced as verified World Records. Competition was high and many came to swim, hard. South Africa was represented by some 15 avid, enthusiastic, fun making swimmers. There were the life of the party. The US was represented by about the same number. Not quite so wound up. There was a local meet the weekend after Pan-Pac which was interesting in that they swam 12 events and relays in under two hours. It was really a workout although one was limited to 3 events and a relay. This pool was heated through a heat exchanger, by hot water from the earth. The outdoor pool was heated to around 88-90 degrees by same heat, but the water was filtered. The Greerton pool, Tauranga.

In the 6000 Yard Postal Swim sponsored by the Richardson Masters, Via Enneking placed first in the 35-39 age group setting a record with a time of 1hr, 23 min, 19.99 sec. She also placed 8th overall. K.D. Pollman placed 5th overall and 2nd in the 30-34 age group with a time of 1hr, 22 min, 44.99 sec. Two FAST Masters members placed second in their age group in the 1992, 2000 Yard Swim Challenge: K.D. Pollman (30-34) and Barbara Evans (55-59).

HARBOUR ISLAND ATHLETIC CLUB MASTERS SWIM TEAM

Jeff Copper has taken over primary coaching responsibilities at HIAC, sharing deck time with Coach Milt Bedingfield, who also continues to coach Forest Hills while planning a May wedding. Under Jeff's enthusiastic coaching, HIAC's program has swelled, welcoming nearly a dozen new swimmers at all levels. With a pool full of (mostly) triathletes, Jeff emphasizes speed and endurance, and has gotten swimmers into the weight room for an up-"lifting" program. Jody Bedran and Natalie Bayol will share registrar's duties, with the move to Sarasota of former registrar Barbara Lane and husband, Jeff. Both Barbara and Jeff plan to swim with the Sarasota Masters team and make their winning appearances at area meets.

ST. PETE MASTERS

The following was taken from the March, 1993 St. Petersburg Masters newsletter: St. Pete Masters had four teams compete in the 10K-2 Relay. Barbara Prescott and Bruce Day placed 5th in the 40-44 age group. Beverly Tucker and Bob Beach placed 1st in the 55-59 age group. Mary Boaz and Mary Lou Mitchell were 2nd in the women's 60-64 age group and Kay Schimpf and John Johnston placed 1st in the 75-79 age group. 1993 FEBRUARY FITNESS CHALLENGE

The results of the "February Fitness Challenge" are in. There were 606 participants nation wide contributing to the total monthly yardage of 32,996,631 or 18,749.09 miles. The top 10 cities (listed in order) are: Baton Rouge, LA; Lexington, KY; Gowanda, NY; New York, NY; Dallas, TX; Austin, TX; Midlothian, VA; Davis, CA; Oakland, CA; and Seattle, WA.

A total of 24 Floridians entered the Fitness Challenge. Scott Coleman finished 2nd overall with 252,220 yards and placed 1st in his age group (35-39). Bill Haverland finished 4th overall with 241,716 yards and placed 1st in his age group (45-49). Herbert Fielder placed 3rd in his age group (60-64) with 80,290 yards.

Edna Gordon said it was impossible to get a total monthly yardage for Suncoast Masters Swimmers since their members swim at various times and different places and cities. She hopes that they mailed in their yardage on an individual basis.

MINUTES OF THE GENERAL FLMSC MEETING, APRIL 3, 1993

The general business meeting, held at the North Shore Pool in St. Pete, was called to order by John Maguire.

Present: Chairman John Maguire; Secretary Meegan Wilson; Treasurer Richard L. Avery; Newsletter Editor Frank Tillotson; Registrar Charles Kohnken. The following clubs were represented: Dave Perkey, CATM; Pate Cantrell, FAST; Richard Avery, HLJ; John P. Bishop, SPM; Mike Castle, TEAM; and Al Rogerson, BSAM.

I. General Business

A. Treasurer Report

Richard Avery reported a bank balance of \$10,342.53.

B. Registrar Report

Charles Kohnken reported that we have 782-783 members. We need 800 members to have 3 delegates represent the FLMSC at the National Convention.

Charlie requests that club registrars review each registrations carefully and correct any errors before sending them to him. Many forms sent in have address errors, etc. He is preparing an instruction sheet that will help registrars.

We also need to update Club Delegates and/or team representatives. Each Club should designate a Club Delegate who will represent their team at LMSC meetings and accept the responsibility of passing on LMSC information to their membership.

C. Recorder's Report

Catie Cooper sent her report since she was unable to attend. At the time of this meeting Catie has still not received the results of the Tampa meet. She reminds meet directors that they should get their results to her within three weeks after the meet to assure that no fees are deducted from their security deposit.

Relay times at Y-Nationals will count for top 10 consideration, if the official results, a copy of each members USMS Registration Card, and a xerox copy of the official relay card is sent to Catie Cooper. The relay card must contain the name of the USMS club, the names and ages of all 4 relay members, the event and event #, and the heat and lane assignment. All four relay members must be registered to the same USMS team. She suggests that the above information be sent to her as soon as possible.

D. Newsletter

Frank Tillotson requested that all newsletter items be sent either to John Maguire or to Meegan Wilson since he will be out of town for the next newsletter. Newsletter items are due by April 23 for mid May publication.

II. New Business

A. "Coach Of The Year" and Male/Female "Swimmers Of The Year"

John Maguire requests that clubs send in their LMSC "Coach of the Year" nominations by May 15. Ballots will be sent to LMSC members and the winner will be sent on for National consideration. This award is presented annually to the coach who has done the most to further the objectives of Masters Swimming. These objectives can be found in the 1993 Rules book.

He also requests that nominations for Male and Female "Swimmer of the Year" be submitted by June 1. These nominations should include the swimmers accomplishments and other reasons for their nomination. Ballots will be sent to FLMSC members and the winners will be announced at the St. Pete Long Course Championships on July 16-18.

B. Meet Scheduling

John Bishop suggests that meets be scheduled further in advance so that there is less chance of overlap. The Clearwater meet was not well attended and conflicted with the Florida Gold Coast LMSC meet in Boca. He also feels that there are too many meets which decreases attendance. John Maguire said one problem is that the host team fails to obtain a commitment from facilities far enough in advance. Commitments should be obtained at least 5 - 7 months in advance.

Other suggestions for increasing attendance were to change meet formats, hold dual meets, and hold meets at new places. Both Richard Avery and John Bishop have talked with Tiger Holmes about having a meet in Jacksonville.

Dave Perkey announced that the long course meters meet, August 7-8, in Clearwater has been canceled due to the high cost of renting the Long Center. The two day meet would cost \$1500 just to rent the pool.

C. 1993 National Convention

The 1993 National Convention will be held in Los Angeles in September 22-26. The Florida LMSC can send 3 delegates. John Maguire will consider those who are interested in attending.

With no further business the meeting was adjourned.

1993 USMS 2000 SWIM CHALLENGE

This year for the first time the 2000 SWIM CHALLENGE will be run through the National Fitness Committee with New York's Niagara District administering the meet.

Several changes in format have been made, most significantly USMS registration is not required. It's our hope that by doing so we will encourage the participation of triathletes, runners and lap swimmers across the country and at the same time create an opportunity to publicize the advantages of USMS membership. Of course, for all swimmers it's a challenge at a distance which is considerably less intimidating than the 6000!

Meet information will appear in the magazines "FITNESS SWIMMER" and "SWIM" and, as you can see, competitors may swim 2000 yards or 2000 meters, or enter in both distances if they wish to do so. The distance(s) must be swum during the period from June 1 to July 31.

We encourage you to use the challenge as part of a practice workout, to circulate the meet sheet through your newsletters and at local Y's, JCC's, and other pools frequented by non-USMS athletes.

Participants will receive a copy of the results, a specially designed t-shirt and information about USMS. If you have something you would like mailed to people in your area, e.g. a list of places to swim or contact people/phone numbers, or if you have any questions, please contact me.

Your help in promoting the meet and your participation will be greatly appreciated.

We'll let you know at the convention how many accepted the challenge!




