#### Memories of America's Longest Running Masters Swim Meet

James M. Donnelly

turned 26 years old on the last day of the 5th Annual Southern Regional Masters AAU Swim Championships in St. Pete, February 28, March 1 & 2, 1975. You had to be 25 years old, back then, in the olden days, to compete in Masters swimming. I had just started swimming again in the fall of '74 immediately after discovering there was such a thing as Masters swimming! So here I was, at one of my first Masters meets, almost 4 years to the day since my last college meet, the NCAA Division II Nationals. It was really depressing for me when I finished my college swimming career because I thought all the competition and the comaraderie that went with it was over. During my first Southern Regionals I knew that I had a lifetime of good health, competition, and goal setting all ahead of me, and best of all, a new family of friends.

A lot of the swimmers I met at my first Regionals are still swimming today. Chip Jones, our LMSC Treasurer, was there. George Burke, John Edwards, Pete Betzer, John Ziegler, Ray Burns, Bump Jones, Bob Beach, Jim Gotch, Herb Kern, Snag Holmes, Frank Tillotson, Lynn Cartee, Boots Culbertson, Anne

McGuire, and Scottie
Holliday were all there

There were many more "ties" in those days of yesteryear attributed to the judgment of the place judge and the lack of electronic touch pads that would have timed the race out to the thousandth of a second. I had two ties myself that weekend, one with John Ziegler in the 50 Breast - 32.0, and another with Bruce Bartling in the 100 IM - 1:03.8.

Bump Jones and Gay Rosser, teammates from the 1952 Olympic Games in Helsinki, would battle it out in the 40-44 age group. (They were 41 at that meet.)


You could hear Gay's powerful kick from anywhere in the pool, a freight train loaded with dynamite. He's not with us anymore...cancer took him in his prime.

Everyone looked forward to the socials at this meet. In those early years we would all go to Shakey's Pizza (they sponsored the trophies) on Friday night following the 1650, for pizza and what seemed like endless pitchers of beer. No one worried about overpartying, after all, your competitor was sitting right there with you! But the social on Saturday night, held in the "Blue Room" of the Edgewater Motel adjacent to the pool, and on the beautiful grounds outside of it, on Tampa Bay, was always the "best" social anyone could ever put on. The "Hawaiian Luau", as it was officially dubbed, was the place where you would wear your wildest Hawaiian shirt.

You could count on 2-3 kegs of beer and all the food you could eat for only \$ 6.00. The most memorable meet and social was the year that about a dozen German swim teams attended the meet to swell the

participants to over 400 swimmers. We all exchanged pins with our European guests and they all gave us little bottles of "4711". Everyone who made their reservations early enough had the fortune

to stay right there at the Edgewater Motel. You could eat breakfast there the next morning, or go to the "Frog Restaurant" on 4th Street.

The Edgewater, and the "Frog" were torn down a few years later so the accommodations and the party moved to one of Beverly Tucker's quaint old hotels, like the Penn Flora. (Beverly is a St. Pete swimmer). Except for a few seasonal guests, the swimmers would take over the whole place. There wasn't any TV in the rooms (or air conditioning) and the beds were so soft that swimmers like Scott Guthrie would choose to


sleep on the floor so he wouldn't damage his back, but that all added to the charm.

It's still the meet where you'll kill yourself swimming eleven maximum events in competition for that individual High Point Trophy. It's the big meet where the whole team gets together to swim those important relays that may give you the points you need for the Team Trophy. The Suncoast Masters of Sarasota won the Combined Team High Point Trophy for the first time that year, in 1975, and continued to win it for quite a few years in a row. I can remember the whole team drinking champagne out of that big silver cup trophy after we won the meet for the second time in a row. you tell... I just love this meet!

A lot of important things happened to me during the years I've attended the meet. I married Kandy (we met at a swim practice) between the 6th and 7th Annual Meet; we had twins between the 9th and 10th Annual Meet, and our third child between the 11th and 12th Annual Meet. The 25th Annual St. Pete Masters Short Course Championship Silver Anniversary Meet will be my 21st in a row and I know there will be some swimmers there who haven't missed a one since that first one back in 1971.



# SWIM THE FLORIDA

Masters swimming is alive and well in Southwest Florida. We now have four locations for workouts. In Ft. Myers at the Cypress Lake Middle School pool, coached workouts are held three evenings a week and Sat. mornings. This is a newer, growing group of about 20 swimmers. In Naples, workouts are held two evenings a week and Sun. afternoon at the YMCA. This is a long-established self-coached group of about a dozen or more. In Bonita Springs at the community pool a newer, small group of half a dozen senior masters works out several mornings a week under their own club charter, not officially affiliated with FLORIDA. In east Naples, at the Golden Gate community pool, a brand, new group has formed, coached by county employee Rich DeGalen. They hold three evening sessions per week. Away to the deep end MARK went oh so quick, swam past FRANK and TOM but not faster than RIC.


When what should appear to the wondering eyes of MILT, but eight swimmers all going at a full tilt.

You have worked really hard and mostly without let-up. Would it not be a great pity to ruin all that pain, that agony-soaked time, by indifference to streamlining off the wall, by slowing into the turns, by careless turns, and by rules infractions behavior? I can think of breaststrokers and flyers, grabbing onehanded, backstrokers rolling off on their fronts, and long reaching gliding finishes on all strokes. Now is the time to get rule conscious. Now is the time to improve those indifferent turns - to think streamlining, to kick off the walls. Let's make every item on the workout a competition perfect performance. As has been said repeatedly: only good practice makes perfect.

If the qualifying times for Nationals are to be so tough, then it behooves each and everyone of us to explore every avenue to improve times. So think of the little things that can be put right - work on them - and improvement is a must!

In your recent newsletter, you published information about a change to the freestyle stroke, specifically that "In freestyle, the swimmer's head must break the surface of the water not more than 15 meters (16.4 yds.) after the start and after each turn." This information is incorrect. There was a proposal made to United States Swimming (which if passed, would have been adopted by United States Masters Swimming) to change the rule to read this way, but it was defeated.

Please read the correct information (see 1995 Rule Book, Sections 101.1.1 Forward Start and 101.5 Freestyle) to your swimmers in your next newsletter. Thank you for your cooperation.



#### **Major USMS Rules Changes for 1995**

- Warm-Up Procedure: Swimmers must enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner. (Article 102.4.2)
- Backstroke Start: The Starter must direct the swimmers to "Place your feet" before directing them to "Take your mark." (Article 103.2.3C)
- Relay Lead-Off Split Times: An official time may now be achieved in a relay lead-off split, provided the swimmers complete the event without being disqualified, and provided automatic timing is used (Articles 103.8.1C, 103.8.3, 105.2.2, 105.3.7)
- National Qualifying Times: The method for determining qualifying times for National Championship Meets shall be 10 percent over the previous year's tenth place time on the USMS Top Ten list. (Article 104.5.3C(1))
- Club Scoring at National Championship Meets: Divisions are now Large, Medium, and Small instead of Large and Small only. (Article 104.5.5.6C)
- Individual Split Times: For a split time recorded for an initial distance within a longer event to count as an official time, the swimmer must comply with the finish rule at the initial distance; e.g., for the 100 split in a 200 backstroke to be considered an official time, the swimmer must touch the wall while on the back, rather than turning ento the stomach and executing a flip turn. (Articles 103.8.1B, 105.2.2, 105.3.7)
- **Breaststroke:** The elbows shall be under the water except for the last stroke at the finish of the prescribed distance. (Article 101.2.2)
- Liability Release: Only registration forms and entry forms for sanctioned events must include the liability release. Entry forms for recognized events are no longer required to include the liability release. (Article 203.1)
- Starts for Long Distance Events: The starting signal shall be audible and visible to all contestants. (Article 304.1.2)
- Long Distance Postal Events: Two new National Championship events, 5 kilometers (in a 50 meter pool) and 3000 yards (in a 25 yard pool), have been added. The 6000 yard (in a 25 yard pool) event has been discontinued.





# NEW FINA RULES for WORLD RECORDS and FINA WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP MEETS

tarting with swims performed after September 1, 1994, the following rules are in effect for World Records:

- 1 You have 60 days to submit an application for a World Record.
- 2 Additional age groups were added to include 90-94, 95-99, 100-104...
- 3 Relay age groups now have upper limits; 100-119, 120-159, 160-199, 200-239, 240-279, 280-319, 320-359...
- 4 "Age shall be determined as of December 31 of the year of competition." This applies to individual events and to relays. This means that as of January 1 of each year everyone ages up one year. For example, if you will be 40 years old sometime during 1995 then you can set World Records as a 40-year-old starting January 1, 1995. Since USMS did not adopt this age determining rule (we still use the last day of competition to determine our age), it will be up to you, the swimmer, to call to the attention of the meet director that you qualify for World Records in the next older age group.
