## Walker Breaks World Record

Deb Walker's first meet in the 45-49 age group made quite a splash - one World Record and four Florida LMSC Records.


Deb Walker, who just aged up to 45, and swims for Suncoast Masters Swimming in Sarasota, eclipsed the 200 M Breaststroke world mark by more than a second during the St. Petersburg Long Course Championships at

the North Shore Pool, July 12-14, 1996.

Deb's time of 3:05.29 bettered the previous world mark of 3:06.34 by South Africa's Susan Tyler. Florida LMSC records were also broken by this speedster in the 50 M Breaststroke - 39.79, the 100 M Breaststroke - 1:26.33 and the 200 M I.M. - 2:54.94.

"This was my first time in this age-group and it was fun," Walker said after returning from watching some Olympic swimming competition in Atlanta. "But I know I can go faster. I really didn't know about the records, but it is an honor and something to set as goals."

"We'll be trying to go even faster in a couple of weeks in Coral Springs (Aug. 2-4), That's considered our end- of-the- year

meet. That would be a nice time to swim even faster." Deb's husband Rick,



#### SHORT COURSE YARDS SEASON

- Top 10 was submitted to Walt Reid on 7/5/96, 10 days prior to the deadline. I would have submitted it sooner, but I was still waiting for the IRCC meet results to come. Walt informed me that IRCC sent their meet results directly to him. When he finishes entering them, he will send them back to me.
- ZONE Top 10 report was sent to Rocky Motter on 7/8/96 without the IRCC results. Once I receive those results from Walt, I will send them onto Rocky. She is aware of the problem.
- Again this year, the relay times achieved in the IRCC meet will not be considered for TOP 10 or records because important documentation was missing (full names and ages of the relay team members for each relay). This is the same reason why relay times for the IRCC meet have not been considered in the past.
- 5) I am currently working on the Florida Top 5. It will be submitted to Jim Donnelly in the near future after I have received the IRCC meet results and have added any other record and/or top 5 swims.
- 6) While many records had been broken during the Short Course Season, there are a number I would like to mention here because these individuals have smashed (in most cases) long-standing records and deserve special recognition. They are as follows:

#### LONG-COURSE SEASON

All meet results submitted to me thus far have been processed and entered into the computer.

#### NEW ITEM

For USMS, Dixie Zone, and Florida LMSC Top 10 record and tabulation consideration, a swimmer must have competed for his/her USMS-registered club. We have a number of swimmers registered with both USMS and with a masters club outside the United States, in Canada, England, or elsewhere. This is fine and is legal. However, if such swimmer competed at any meet under his or her non-USMS registered club name, those times cannot be accepted for USMS, Zone, or LMSC records or top 10 consideration.

## Memories of Gold

Harrison Glancy, the oldest living U.S. Olympic gold medalist, remembers the glory days of 1924.

arrison Glancyhas experienced the thrill of the Olympic moment twice - 72 years apart.

In 1924, he stood on the victory platform at the Paris Summer Games, pinching himself to make sure he wasn't dreaming.

And on July 4, 1996, he was the first to carry the Oympic torch on its swing through Sarasota.


Glancy arrived with a cane in his hand, but when he was handed the torch, he passed off the cane and proudly carried the flame. He wasn't sure if he'd be able to make it the full three-tenths of a mile he was scheduled to carry the torch. But once he began, a smile spread across his face, his stride quickened, and he made it without a problem.

"You must feel like a million bucks, Harry!" one man yelled to him.

"I do", he replied, the torch still in his hand, "I surely do."

"Go Harry!" one woman yelled as the crowd swelled to several hundred people in the usually quiet north Sarasota neighborhood. "Yeah, Harrison! Way to go!"

For the 91-year-old Glancy, the cheers came like echoes from the 1924 and 1928 Olympic Games (in Amsterdam) where he won Gold medals in the 800-meter freestyle relays. Johnny Weissmuller was one of his teammates on those relays.



Over 100,000 people, some of whom endured heavy rain during the morning portion of the torch run, came out for the event in Manatee and Sarasota counties. A spokeswoman for the torch run said, "This has been one of the best receptions we've gotten so far."

The spectators lining the streets were thrilled to see Glancy - the nation's oldest gold medalist. His son, Jerry, a National Champion master swimmer from Team Orlando Masters, swears that his dad straightened his 91-year-old back as he held the torch aloft.

"It makes me feel very good that I would be remembered so many years later, said Glancy. "It's a personal satisfaction to know your accomplishment is something that didn't fade away."

"I can't quite explain it", he said, marveling still at the power of the Olympics. "When you stand on the platform and they put the medal on your chest, that puts chills down your back, and you have

## Swimming News From Around The LMSC

## Blue Wave Masters

Sue Moucha has won a berth on the 1996 United States Disabled Team and will be swimming at the Paralympics in Atlanta. Opening ceremonies will be held on Thursday, August 15th. The Paralympic Trials, were held at the Natatorium, Indiana University, site of the regular Olympic Swimming Team Trials. The Team members were announced following competition on May 5th.

The criteria for selecting the team was based on world ranking, following preliminary and finals. A total of 38 swimmers from 85 were selected. Sue ranks 5th in the world for her class in the 100 m Breaststroke, with a time of 2:07.94. She also established a new American record in the 200 I.M., with a time of 4:38.99. Sue swims both Breaststroke and Butterfly with one arm. She also plans to swim the 50 m Backstroke and 50 m Butterfly.

Sue, was born with hemeplegic Cerebral Palsy, involving her right side, but has never let it keep her from athletics. With a master's degree in physical education from Texas Women's College, Moucha's home boasts 75 trophies for swimming, and in 1984 she took home the Gold for cross country in the Paralympics as well as the Gold for track in 1988. She is doubly proud of the fact that the shelves in her home hold 207 trophies for able-bodied running.

Sue is a Class S5, which was

determined by her functional ability to perform a certain stroke. On a 1 - 10 range, the higher the number, the greater the swimmers ability. A member of the U.S. Cerebral Palsy Athletic Association, she will be competing with swimmers representing Dwarfs, Amputees, Spinal Cord and Wheelchair Sports in her class.

This is Sue's fourth Paralympic Team. She was also selected as a torchbearer to carry the Olympic torch when it came through Tampa, Florida in July.

Florence Carr set a new national record (70-74) in the 100 y l.M. with a 1:30.42. She also placed 1st in the 100 and 200 y free, 50 y fly and 200 y l.M., while winning a silver in the 500 free.

Jayne Lambke (55-59), took 1st in the 50, 100, 200, and 500 y free and just missed first in the 100 y fly.

Sandy Steer (55-59), swam to a 4th in the 50 y breaststroke, 5th in the 1000 free, 7th in the 200 y breaststroke, 8th in the 100 y breaststroke, and 10th in the 200 & 500 y free.

Margaret Van Every - 3rd - 50 & 200 y breaststroke, 4th - 50 Back, 5th - 100 breaststroke, 6th - 100 I.M., and 8th 100 Back.

Bill Specht led our 35-39 team with victories in the 50, 100, and 200 y fly while winning silver in the 50, 100, and 200 back.

Bob Buresh, who does his solo training in Arkansas, scored many points for us with a 4th in the 50 back, 5th - 100 back, 9th - 200 back, and 10th 50 and 100 fly. It's great to have you on the team, Bob!

Tim Kennedy, another of the 211 swimmers in the very competitive 35-39 age group, placed 10th in the 100 free.

Konrad Euler (60-64) swimming in his first Nationals for SPM, placed 8th in the 200 y fly and the 100 y free.

Paul Hutinger (70-74), also had an outstanding meet as he won the 50, 100, and 200 y back and the 100 y l.M. and placed 2nd in the 50 y fly.

The women's 55+ freestyle relay team of Jayne Lambke, Sandy Steer, Margaret Van Every and Florence Carr placed third.

Coach George Bole was there to cheer us on in every race!

#### **Swim Around Key West**

The event has grown from a two person challenge some 20 years ago into a 300 strong entry to swim around the island - some 12.8 miles. Laura Kaleel was our highest individual placer - the 5th woman - in 5 hours, 21 minutes. Lisa Abraham had a splendid swim to gain 7th place. Others to complete the distance were Meredith Brower, Time Moore, and Tom Wells. This was no mean feat, considering the weather was stormy and the water rough.

There were also team events: three

man (each swimming 4.2 miles) and some six man teams. There were 16 of the latter, SPM with 2 entries, winning 1st and 9th places.
