


3 y the till the Lor ended

Ark the "Swimming" Doctor
by Dr. Paul Hutinger

**QUESTION:** Can a Master swimmer change his old breaststroke to the new style used by the Olympians?

ANSWER: Yes. Although it's not that difficult to change from the flat old fashioned style to the newer wave style breaststrioke, you need to make a full commitment to the new technique. At a recent meet in Sarasota, several swimmers reverted to their old stroke halfway through the race. Concentrate on the stroke rhythm. and not a performance time in your event, while you are changing styles.

The arm stroke uses a delayed breathing on the insweep, and a pause during the streamline position. The hands accelerate from slow on the outsweep to fast on the insweep (don't stop to pray), and extend to a streamlined position, head down.

Drill: (Use fins or Zoomers) Use a dolphin

kick and the breaststroke pull for a set of 10 x 25 on 45 secs. The hands are about six inches under to begin the outsweep. Change from out and back to down and back to begin the insweep, then inward until palms come together, and elbos are near the surface. Dive and extend the arms. Shrug the shoulders at the end to start the next outscull. Shrugging the shoulders narrows the shoulders and reduces resistance. Try to raise out of the water, keeping elbos close to the surface, then dive, head down and streamlined. The hips move forward like an inchworm on the insweep. Moving the hips forward and arching the back brings the head up tp breathe, with immediate dive (lunge) forward to streamline.

The body is flat on the surface in the wave stroke, with the feet kicking downward fron the surface, causing the hips to raise. **Recover the legs by bringing the feet to the buttocks,** not by pulling the knees forward.

Beginners should use the glide pattern with a pause after the kick in the streanline position. Some swimmers, using the wave style, come up higher than others, so find a rhythm that works for you and the flexibility that you have. If you don't have a coach, work with a swim partner to learn this new technique

# From the Editor's Swim Bag

didn't go to the Masters Long Course Nationals in Orlando this August, opting instead for the Phillips 66 National Championships in Nashville, Tennessee, the last week in July. (No I didn't make the qualifying times for the meet, but my 17 year old son Eric was there for the 400 m I.M. and The 1500 m free.) While I was there I saw all of the nation's top swimmers and have lots of inside information that you would never find in any other media source.

One of the highlights of the meet was watching the eight fastest "hot dogs" in the country swim the 50 m free. Among the eight swimmers in the Championship Final were BIII Pilczuk 25, Neil Walker 21, David Fox 26, Jon Olsen 28, and Gary Hall, Jr. 22, all Olympians and / or NCAA Champions. Gary Hall, the biggest hot dog of them all, was always smiling, his big "gold star" front tooth glittering! They introduced the swimmers before they stepped up on the blocks, and after introducing Gary Hall Jr. in lane 7 as the Olympic Silver medalist in this event, he cupped his left hand under his right armpit and pumped out a couple of quick "fart" noises to the delight of all of us who used to do that at swim practice back in the sixties! (His dad, Master swimmer Gary Hall, Sr. must have taught him.) Gary's humorous ploy to psych out his competition didn't work, as he finished in 5th place. Bill Pilczuk, Auburn U., won the event in 22.45, and after being asked what he plans to do in order to beat Alexander Popov at the World Championships, he replied, "Popov has to beat me!" Jager, who still holds the World Record in this event with a time of 21.81, presented the awards to the top eight finalists.

Nell Walker, who was the NCAA Swimmer of the Year last season for Texas, has turned out to be the story of these championships. He has finished first or second in all four of his events, setting a meet record in

the 100 m fly, 53.06. Walker, the American Record holder in the 100 m back, broke his hand during the second day of competition at the NCAA's during a backstroke finish and is just now getting back to being the dominant swimmer he was before the accident. He has

qualified for seven different events at the W o r I d Championships in Australia

Masters swimmer Karlyn Pipes-Neilsen, who at age 35, had to be the oldest swimmer competing in the meet, swam a respectable

2:20.86 for a 29th place in the 200 M back. The average age of the 65 swimmers who qualified for this event was about 17 years old. You've all seen Karlyn featured in several **SWIM** Magazines.

The 200 M I.M. final was a two way race between Ron Karnaugh 31, and Tom Dolan 21. Karnaugh qualified first in the prelims with a 2:03.58, just .20 faster than Dolan. The Finals saw Dolan take his fly out in 26.34 leading by .13 secs. Karnaugh was .03 ahead of Dolan after his backstroke leg, but Dolan finished with a strong breaststroke and free

leg to win in 2:01.18 to Karnaugh's 2:02.88.

**Sad Janet:** Four-time Olympic gold medalist **Janet Evans** was in town as the manager of the **Rose Bowl** swim team, but maybe she might be better in the water than out of it.

Evans had made it a priority to buy donuts everyday for her swimmers (**Krispy Kreme**). That might have gotten her in a spot of trouble.

"I can't really talk right now," she said. "I've got to take one of my swimmers to the hospital. I think all the donuts I've been buying might have made one of them sick."

I saw Janet again later that evening at Schlotzky's Deli. I was

waiting sandwich to be made when Janet walked in with a few of her swimmers. I had picked up my order and was on my way over to say hello to her when she dumped the contents of her purse all over the floor in front of the cashier. Whoops. Bad timing. I'll get her autograph next time.





# Walker sets third world swim record

eb Walker set her second and third world record at the Long Course Nationals in Orlando. Competing in the 45-49 age group, Deb swam a 3:01.64 in the 200 m breaststroke to smash her own world record of 3:05.12 set earlier at the Suncoast Masters L.C. Meet in June. Deb surprised herself by setting the world mark of 2:46.04 in the 200 m I.M. Deb's third world record is in the 100 m breast in the 40-44 age group (1:21.74).

"I had a great meet, but I worked my butt off for it," Deb said after winning four events at Nationals. She was also first in both the 100 m breaststroke - 1:23.94, and 50 m breast - 38.88, and third in the 100 m back.

Walker attributes much of her success to Olympic medalist **Anthony Nesty** with whom she coaches at the **Sarasota Boys & Girls Club Swim Florida Chapter**.

"Anthony has taught me valuable lessons. Too many athletes get caught up in the gimmicks of training - vitamins, diet, stretching, massages, etc.

"Instead, I concentrate on two aspects - good technique and good conditioning - and it paid off."




