### TOP TEN AND RECORDS by Margie Hutinger



My submitted times for the 2000-2001 Top Ten have been received. They included three Senior meets (Martin Co, State Champ and Polk Co), four large meets (FHA, CATM, SPM

and IRCC), three SPM development meets and Y Nationals relays from SWIM and FMM (only clubs indicating Y swimmers

were on the same Masters team).

In addition, the Florida Top 5 includes meets from outside the FL LMSC, including Plantation; Charlotte, NC; Auburn, Al; ISHOF; Atlanta, Raleigh, YMCA and SCY Nationals. Our newsletter editor, Gertie Perry, Dianetics Swim Team, was the only FL LMSC swimmer to swim all 18 events. She made the Top 5 in 16 of them. In July, I mailed the 2001 SCY FL Top 5 and records to clubs and subscribers. The extra SCY 2000 Top 5 copies are available to any swimmers or team that are interested. This is good publicity for Masters swimming and informs our swimmers of an ongoing LMSC program.

I would like to acknowledge and recognize the outstanding FL LMSC record breaking SCY swims for 2001. Patricia Bond took top honors by breaking two of the oldest records, from 1983. Joseph Kurtzman was runner up, breaking a 1984 record. The top record breakers were Florence Carr, FMM (75-79) 8 records and Don McCullough (85-89) FMM, 7 records. The oldest records still on the books are Carrie Merson, 80-84, 50 back, 1983 and Chester Miltenberger, 30-34, 1982. Updated records are in this issue.

**Rick Walker** (50-54) SWIM--500 free-5:14.22; broke Burwell Jones' SMS time of 5:25.99, from 1985.

**Rick Walker** (50-54) SWIM-1000 free-10:45.85; broke Burwell Jones' SMS time of 11:36.51. from 1985.

**Rick Walker** (50-54) SWIM-1650 free-18:06.88; broke Burwell Jones' SMS time of 18:53.29, from 1985.

Joseph Kurtzman (75-79) FMM-100 fly-1:33.53; broke Bill Stinson's SPM time of 1:40.97, from 1984.

Twelve 400 free and medley relay records were established at the IRCC

meet in April. Altogether, 40 women's, 38 men's, and 18 relay records were broken.





As meet director of a large meet, it has always bothered me that as the meet wears on throughout the day there appears to be more and more talk about "scratching the 500" because swimmers are tired - naturally. Even if they do not scratch and swim the event they are still somewhat tired due to their previous events. For anyone trying to achieve a really good time in this event it would appear that they should do it earlier in the meet when they are more fresh. Another reason for this is the meet becomes very anticlimactic as the only swimmers usually left at the end of the meet are the 400 IM and 500 free participants. The high point awards and team awards presentations at the meets conclusion are poorly attended where many winners are often not even in attendance when their name is called. 



Rick Walker (50-54) and Kevin McCormack (45-49) were the only SWIM Florida Masters to travel to Santa Clara, CA for the USMS SCY Nationals, but they represented the club well! Walker placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 1650 free, 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 500 free, and 5<sup>th</sup> in the 200 free. McCormack placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 100 fly and 4<sup>th</sup> in the 50 fly.

Twenty-six SWIM Florida Masters competed in the April 26-29 YMCA Nationals at Sarasota and captured ten individual championships and one relay championship. The group represented Y teams from Sarasota, Collier County, Marco Island, and Orlando, National champions were Larry Black (1000 free, 1650 free), Casey Claflin (100 back, 200 back), Dren Geer (100 fly), Chris Gilligan (200 back), Kent McWherter (100 fly, 400 IM), Pam Mumma (50 free), and John Woods (100 free). The Men's 45+ 200 Medlev Relay of Casey Claflin, Jim Donnelly, Kevin McCormack, and Dave Hefner also won a national championship.

The Dixie Zone/SWIM Florida Masters Long Course Championships were held June 23-24 in Sarasota and produced a number of record swims in spite of losing all of Saturday's events to severe thunderstorms. June Krauser (GOLD) set world records in the 200 fly and 200 IM and an American record in the 100 breast to lead the record run. Joe Kurtzman (FMM) broke a Dixie Zone record in the 200 fly as did the FMM 320+ 800 free relay team of Frank Tillotson, Gertrud Zint, Gladys Olsen, and Robert Williams. New Florida LMSC records were set by Pam Mumma (SWIM) in the 50 free, Deb Walker (SWIM) in the 50 and 100 breast, John McCall (ORLM) in the 200 fly, Don Pulchalski (CATM) in the 100 breast, and three relay teams: Men's 120+ 800 free (GSC-- David Quillen, David Murphy, Stewart Dawson, Don Gornto), Men's 200+800 free relay (SWIM-- Rick Walker, Jim Redic, Jim Sweeting, Rudy Vazmina), and the Mixed 200+ 800 free relay (SWIM-- Chris Gilligan, Dren Geer, Cheryl DiMeo, Robert Davie).



Special custom ceramic trophies went to **JoAnn Harrelson** (SPM) for the meet's Most Valuable Swimmer and to the top three clubs in both the

large and small visiting team categories.
Large team trophies went to Florida
Maverick Masters (1st), St. Pete Masters
(2nd), and Gold Coast Masters (3rd).
Small team trophies went to CAT
Masters (1st), Gator Swim Club (2nd),
and 300 Club (3rd). First, second, and
third individual high point winners
received Jim Donnelly-designed T-shirts.





## ASK THE SWIM DOCTOR

Question: What are the components of a successful program for Masters swimmers?

Answer: The first answer by many would be the training program. Many highly competitive swimmers use their coach's own workouts or computer generated workouts, like Hy Tek. Noncompetetive swimmers, will modify these workouts or find another workout that applies to their goals and time restraints. Scott Rabalais, 1996 Masters Coach of the Year and Chair of the Masters Coach's Association, lists an all inclusive combination of nine items: cardiovascular conditioning, strength, technique, flexibility, kinesthetic ability, nutrition, rest, knowledge of swimming and psychology & motivation. Swimmers, such as Jean Troy, 74, says she uses every technique available to beat highly talented swimmers, such as June Krauser. Troy has frequently beaten Krauser in the 50, 100 and 200 free. Many Masters do not have the time or motivation to follow Rabalais' guidelines. However, many items can be part of a healthy lifestyle, like training (at whatever level satisfies you), nutrition and rest. There are many benefits from these basic principles, which are known by most who have been in the program. One area unknown to many, is the benefit to the brain. Many of you know about endomorphs and the runner's or swimmer's high. Many sufferers of depression take drugs, like prozac to normalize the serotonin in the brain.

Research has demonstrated that aerobic exercise, like swim training, increases serotonin levels which combat depression. The potential dangers of mood altering drugs neurotoxicity can also be avoided. Talk during your intervals is also important for an overall positive therapy and improvement in neurogenesis.
