I have compiled the FL SCM results from three meets and submited them. Pieter Cath hopes to have the preliminary Top Ten finished and posted by 2/10. Please check for errors in your age group. Meets include two St Pete development meets and the Orlando Dixie Zone Championships. For the FL Top 5, I added results from Birmingham Univ Masters, NY; Anderson, SC; Indianapolis, IN; Coral Springs, FL and Marietta, GA.

I apologize for not having compiled the FL Top 5 and updated the records. I'm doing the data entry for the One Hour Postal, sponsored by the Mavericks, and I've spent extra time helping son, Chuck, create my program and tweaking it as the entries have started to arrive. By Feb. 1, we expect to have 2000 entries. I appreciate your patience.

I was going to update the records for the 3000/6000 yards postal, but realized my files were blank. After the Hour Postal, I will get all the final results, starting in 1992. This will complete the FL LMSC Postal records.

For the One Hour Postal records, I included final results back to 1989. Charles Kohnken, SPM, gave me additional results, dating back to 1982. It was interesting to see how the distances swum had increased in 20 years. Many of our current FL records, would have been National records in the early 80's. Even our top swimmers, in their younger years, like Burwell Jones, SMS, and Robert Beach, SPM, swam fewer yards than their current counterparts. Some distances were close, but I had no additions.

In closing, we all look forward to seeing you at our First Annual Awards Banquet on Feb. 9^{th} in Clearwater, FL.

SCM DEVELOPMENT MEET, NOV 4



The 320+ women's 800 free relay, with Kay Schimpf, Peggy Hughes, June Reynolds and Florence Carr, crushed the national record time of 20:48.75, with a new time of 18:25.47.

SCM MARIETTA, GA

Florence Carr, 76, continued with her record breaking swims. On December 8 & 9, she swam the 100 m free, in a time of 1:30.54, to break the world record of 1:33.87. She also won the 50 m free, with a time of 39.96, breaking the National record of 40.71. Both these times better the records she set in Anderson, SC, in Nov.

3000/6000 YARDS NATIONAL POSTAL

Our four 3000 yards swimmers were Patricia Bond--2nd; Gladys Olsen--2nd; Gertrud Zint--3rd; Peggy Hughes--4th. The women's 75+ relay, with Olsen, Zint and Hughes, set a new National record with a time of 4:08.38.98. This foursome placed 6th in the women's team division. Hughes won her age group in the 6000 yards event, and also broke her National record from last year, 2:59:46.97 with a new time of 2:54:22:40.

LCM DEVELOPMENT MEET, JAN 13

This was a notable day, as they set four National and one World record in St Petersburg, FL. These were awesome performances, set outdoors, in cool winter temperatures, which started out at 50 degrees and only warmed up to 60 by the end of the meet.



I like this workout because of the Main Set. It's tough but fun.

Warm-Up: 5-10 mins of whatever you want but include a 500 power kick.

Main Set: 400 IM, 200 Back, 400 IM, 200 Breast, 400 IM. IM in descending order.

Warm-Down: whatever you need but include 8×50 stroke only

Note: If you try this work out, ensure you rest as you need to and realize you are trying it on your own volition. And with any physical activity, stop if you feel pain

The fall months have been busy for the club. During September, a number of our swimmers took time to swim the 5K/10K Postal event - we even convinced a few first timers to participate in the event. With the results already tallied, SPM was 3rd overall in team points for the 5K individual and relay swims, with several relays achieving top honors. Bob Beach took second in both the 5K and 10K events for Men 70-74.

In October, the club ventured the I-4 corridor to swim in the Orlando SCM Meet - taking home 2nd place in the team competition. Our travel team was small, but had a solid weekend in the pool. In October a small group took on the 3000/6000 yard Postal swim and SPM concluded the month with a group outing to St. Croix for the Buck Island to Buccaneer 5+ mile Open Water event. Our calendar year ended with a Development Meet on December 2nd. The Development Meet was held in conjunction with a Canned Food Drive. The food collected along with all meet proceeds were donated to a local food bank.

During September 2000, SPM Coach Stephanie Lee attended the ASCA Conference in New Orleans. She attended the conference with Allison Beebe, SPM Swimmer and local high school coach.

On a sadder note, Ruth Switzer, one of the original Suncoast Masters in Sarasota, passed away at the age of 92 on November 27 in Massachusetts. In 1973, she discovered she had an inoperable brain aneurysm and her doctor suggested that swimming might be a helpful activity. So a year later, at the age of 66, she began swimming in what she thought would be a program of simple exercise. Encouraged by her teammates, she entered her first meet that year. Two years later she set USMS records in the 100, 200, 500 and 1650 freestyle events. The following year she won four gold medals at the the USMS Nationals, and in 1984 won three golds and four silvers at the first International Masters Swimming Champonships in Christ Church, New Zealand. But the best prize was that the brain aneurysm that brought her to the pool in the first place disappeared after she began swimming. She credited Masters swimming with saving her life. Known affectionately as "The Duck," she was a great competitor and a wonderful lady. She and her indomitable spirit will be missed.

You are a very vital link in the FL LMSC organization. In fact, we look to you to be our middle men/women in voicing the news that we often pass on. Please realize how important you are to us.

Following are three reports from your LMSC delegates who attended the USMS Convention held in Louisville, KY on November 16-18, 2001.



MARGIE HUTINGER'S Report

COACHES COMMITTEE:

Three well-known Masters coaches presented topics: Scott Rabalais (CRAQ) on "The Technical Differences in Elite Athletes" included a video of the Olympians in the Sydney pool all with underwater camera shots. Michael Collins (Novaquatics) on "How to Build a Powerhouse Team." This young CA coach has built several powerhouse teams. His theme centered around programming his swimmers to be successful, whatever the level. Marty Hamburger (GA) on "Training Cycles to Optimize Your Season" including all levels of skills. To be faster is to be fit; to be fit is to be faster

registration through the Nat'l Office has been successful. The Coaches Comm now has a list of all coaches, which is used for the newsletter and distribution of other information. Most of the LMSCs have a Coaches Rep, who distributes info, ideas and suggestions to the teams, to meet the needs of the LMSC. FL has none. A stipend was proposed to enable local coaches to attend the ASCA clinic, which will include more info geared to Masters, in the future. I suggest Brett Hamlin to be appointed Coaches Rep for our LMSC.

The establishment of the coaches

OFFICIALS: Much discussion was about allowing USA officials to be certified or re-certified at USMS Championship Meets. That was passed. A motion was introduced to establish a USMS Officials certifying body through each LMSC, but that was tabled.

LONG DISTANCE: All Nat'l Championship evaluations were excellent. 42% increase in participation in 5K/10K, presumably due to entry in SWIM. Limits on number of swims that would count for the Long Distance All Star.

RECORDS AND TABULATIONS: Pieter Cath announced that the FINA Bureau voted on 11/9/01 to allow the breastroke kick in fly events, granting the FINA Masters Committee recommendation to exclude that portion of the rule. Ginger Pierson has compiled a data base of all individual records set by USMS swimmers: John Bauman has done the same for relay records and Mary Beth Windrath for results from National Meets. A motion was passed not to count the records that were set before 1972 (Paul Hutinger is objecting to this, as it discriminates against the older swimmers, who were the Masters pioneers)

The records will be available on the USMS website when Matysek develops the software. All national and world records need the printout from the timing system, to assure that the time is accurate. Meet directors need to obtain a complete printout from the timing system after the meet for safekeeping. Committee is working on updating records more often than once per year.

I spoke on the Maverick's Swim to Key West Challenge, to encourage non-competitive swimmers. A committee is working on a Fitness Kit to be mailed to clubs, including all fitness events. A suggestion was made that some of these fitness events be done at the LMSC level, rather than at the National level.

COMMUNICATIONS: USMS offers free web site hosting to LMSCs and Zones. SWIM Magazine has evolved to better represent the interests of USMS, as USMS now has full editorial control. E-mail changes will be made in a more timely manner. One project is to develop seminars to help LMSCs to improve communication.

DIXIE ZONE:

CHAMPIONSHIPS:

Six bids were presented for National Championship in 2003, including Plantation, FL. Deck seeding at Championship Meets was successful.

REGISTRATION: 18 year olds may register, but are not allowed to compete until age 19, which is determined by last day of meet for yards and 12/31/year of meet for meters.

40,000+ Masters swimmers were registered for 2001. Pacific LMSC posts list of names, city, club and registration # of all swimmers. Helpful to coaches and meet directors.

RULE BOOK: The winning Rule Book cover design for 2002, was submitted by Bill Volckening, OR. It will be dedicated to Nancy Ridout, President. It will be available the first of the year.

SAFETY: Swimmer safety is more important than the fear of litigation. Safety Guidelines will be posted on the USMS web site.

SPORTS MEDICINE: Working to include an "Ask the Doctor" feature in SWIM Magazine. Working with Coaches Committee to create a Masters track at the ASCA World Clinic, especially on topics relevant to aging athletes.

ASK THE SWIM DOCTOR

Question: I participate in Masters Swimming for health and fitness, but am worried about prostate problems in my 50+ age group. What ideas do you have for prevention?

Answer: Your swim training is an excellent activity to maintain your cardiovascular health. You are observant to notice the prostate problems in the general population. Athletes like yourself, have higher testosterone levels which can promote BPH (benign prostatic hyperplasis).

According to the experts, like Dr. M. Schachter, all men over fifty, should be checked by a doctor for BPH. This is a usual part of a complete physical. He will give a (DRE) rectal exam and a blood test for levels of PSA (prostate specific antigen). Symptoms of prostate problems include the need to urinate frequently at night.

Research demonstrates that some nutrients can reduce the size of the prostate and reduce symptoms. Farnsworth reported this in Urology Research in 1981.
