Six Florida LMSC Members Receive 2020 USMS Awards

Karyn Austin, Sheila Carpenter-van Dijk, Bob Jennings, Meredith Moore, Jeff Waddle, and Rick Walker all received USMS Awards this year. The awards were presented at the Virtual USMS Annual Meeting in September and the presentation can be found on the 2020 Annual Meeting page on the USMS website.





Coach Karyn Austin received the 2020 Kerry O'Brien Coaches Award. She is the founder of Swam Water Aquatics Gainesville (SWAG) which started in October, 2018. The team continues to grow and has all levels of athletes from beginners to former college swimmers. Her workouts focus mainly on training, endurance and preparing swimmers for triathlon and open water events, but she also trains for swim meets. Karyn achieved Levels 1-3 as a USMS Certified Coach in 2018 and 2019. She is also a Certified USAT Level 2 Coach, a Certified USMS Adult Learn To Swim Instructor, and a Certified Swim Smooth Coach. She shares her love of swimming with her athletes and tries to make the workouts challenging, but fun.

Florida LMSC Newsletter Editor Sheila Carpenter-van Dijk received the 2020 Dorothy Donnelly Service Award. She became the Florida LMSC Newsletter Editor in 2011 and continues in that position to this day. She has produced over 35 newsletters in the past nine years, keeping our members informed of USMS and LMSC activities, as well as allowing clubs to highlight their activities. She put face masks on some of the photos in recent newsletters, exemplifying the current COVID 19 situation. Sheila received the Florida LMSC Service Award in 2015 and swims for St. Pete Masters.





Florida LMSC Vice Chair Bob Jennings received two awards this year, the 2020 USMS Dorothy Donnelly Service Award and the 2020 Kerry O'Brien Coaches Award. Bob has been a member of USMS since 2008 and immediately got involved with his team, Villages Aquatic Swim Team (VAST), volunteering his time as Head Coach and as President from 2014 -2017. He started volunteering with the Florida LMSC in 2011 in the Hospitality Suite at Convention and was elected Florida LMSC Chair in 2012-2018. He has been a Delegate to Convention since 2012 and continued to volunteer in hospitality in 2014 and 2018 when the Convention was in Jacksonville. From 2016 – 2019 he was the Chair of the USMS Coaches Committee. Bob became Florida LMSC Vice Chair

in 2019 - present. Bob received the 2013 Florida LMSC Club Service Award, the 2016 Florida

LMSC Coaches Award, and the 2017 Florida LMSC Service Award. Bob is a USMS Recognized Coach and has achieved Levels 1-3 as a Certified USMS Coach. During the COVID crisis when there was no organized VAST practice he was proactive and provided the team with three to four workouts a week for team members to do on their own.



Florida LMSC Membership Coordinator Meredith Moore received the 2020 Dorothy Donnelly Service Award. She became the Florida LMSC Registrar (now called the Membership Coordinator) in 2006. She also accepted the position of Communications Chair in 2011. She has continued until this year and decided to retire after 14 years of service to the Florida LMSC. Meredith received the Florida LMSC Service Award in 2012 for her service as Registrar and again in 2014 for her service as Communications Specialist. She received the Florida LMSC Club Service Award in 2014 for service to her club, T2NM in Naples Florida. Meredith currently swims for the Sharks in Sarasota. We will miss her presence on the Board.

Coach Jeff Waddle received the 2020 Kerry O'Brien Coaches Award. Joining the Tsunami Masters (SRQM) coaching staff in 2018, he embodies the true spirit of Masters coaching. He came to USMS by way of triathlon, learned to love swimming and found a way to help others find the same passion. He became a certified Adult Learn To Swim Instructor in 2018 and leads Waddle's Adult Swim Academy, helping adults to lose their fear of the water and improve their swimming ability. He became a member of the USMS Ad Hoc Adult Learn-to-Swim Programming Committee in 2020. He expanded his coaching knowledge and achieved Levels 1-3 as a certified USMS coach in 2018 and 2019. Under his direction, the Tsunami group grew to three workouts a day several times a week, and increased their membership. The club hosted



its first meet ever in 2019. Jeff is a kind and patient coach who works to support all swimmers.



Coach Rick Walker received the 2020 Kerry O'Brien Coaches Award. He is Head Coach and founder of the Sarasota Sharks (SHARK) originally called the Sarasota YMCA Sharks Masters (SYSM). In 2006 the club started with three members and has grown to over 300 members today. Rick achieved his USMS Certified Coach status in 2010 and was a Recognized Coach in 2015 and 2016. He served on the USMS Open Water Committee from 2010-2011. In 2011 Rick received the Florida LMSC Coaches Award. Rick inspires Masters swimmers at all levels and has mentored new and current Masters Shark swim coaches. He has been instrumental in the running of two swim meets and one open water race per year as well as volunteering when the Sharks hosted the 2013 Pan American Masters Championships. The Sarasota Sharks Masters club has benefited in

multiple ways because of the leadership of Coach Rick Walker.

2020 Annual Report from your FL LMSC Membership Coordinator

As of October 11, 2020, we had 2118 swimmers registered in the FL LMSC for 2020. (November 1, 2019 - October 11, 2020) We are about 9% behind last year's final October 2019 figure of 2374. *1,569 were RENEWING members registered in 2019 (74%) *187 were RETURNING members registered anytime between 1999-2018 (9%) *362 were brand NEW members (17%) 53% are male, 47% are female. Almost all registrations were done online.

This year, Late Season Registrations started in late May instead of July. In response to COVID-19, USMS offered the rest of this year and all of 2021 for the single year price of \$60. A savings of over \$45. So far, the FL LMSC has had 253 registrations (May 26 -Oct 11) from the date they registered thru the end of 2021. We had 64 Clubs registered in 2020; 74 Clubs in 2019. We had many new Clubs register this year: Bolles Sharks Masters BSSM Jacksonville Fishhawk Masters FHM Lithia Florida Elite FE Lutz For Fun, For Fitness, For Life FFFL Wildwood Miracle Swimming for Adults MSSA Sarasota Sea Dragon Aquatics SDAMS North Port SKY Family YMCA SFYH Venice St Augustine Aquatic Team STAT St Augustine Suncoast Y Masters Swimming SYMS Clearwater Our 10 largest clubs in 2020 were: UC14 - 450 members SHARK - 305 members SPM - 233 members CAM - 149 members FACT - 106 members (largely made up of Workout Groups from the Villages Swim Team and Clearwater Long Center) SRQM -72 members T2NM -71 members YCFM - 70 members HLJ - 69 members GSC - 45 members We had 2 active Workout Groups of FACT: CLCF (Clearwater) and VASF (The Villages) Club registration for 2021 started on October 1st. So far, only 18 Clubs have registered for 2021, including one new Club.

All Clubs **MUST** be registered by October 31st. **2021 swimmer registration begins on November 1st.** Clubs must be registered in order for swimmers to register for a particular Club. We have around 47 Clubs that still need to register for 2021. Also, a Parent Club must register before any Workout Group can register with a parent Club.

The Winter of Wild Swimming Kem Butler Unattached swimmer in Central Florida

The City pool where I swim will be closing soon as it has no heater. Nothing else is close or convenient – so this will be the winter of wild swimming. Florida is home to an abundance of springs, most of which are located within state parks. While the temperature of the spring may be a bit cool for some – 72 degrees year-round – they remain a refreshing option for a sunny day. This is a wonderful way to support your state parks and view the wildlife in their natural setting.

My first trip was to the Rainbow River. Starting the swim at KP Hole Park in Dunnellon (<u>http://www.thekphole.com/</u>) we swam upstream – against the current for over an hour. With a designated time limit of 1.5 hours – we then turned around and floated back down the river – taking our time to look at the plants and fish. Wildlife included turtles, birds, and many different types of fish. We shared the river with 2 groups of divers, many kayakers, and a few canoes and stand-up paddle boarders.

Let's challenge ourselves to try some wild swimming this winter and enjoy the beautiful waters of Florida.
