

In 1992 Scott Rabalais, coach of the Crawfish Masters in Louisiana, implemented the February Fitness Challenge as a postal event for his team. Each swimmer records their yardage each day in the month of February. Kick boards, swim paddles, swim fins, etc. are acceptable. The results are reported by sex and age group. Scott offered his event on a National level and it became a sponsored event of USMS in 1993, open to USMS members and non members. which may motivate non member fitness swimmers to become USMS members. Commemorative T-shirts could be purchased sporting the “Fitness Frog”. That year USMS had 606 participants in the event.

It became an international event in 1994. Scott was presented the inaugural United States Masters Swimming Fitness Award in 1997. Implementation of the event moved to Oregon with the Tualatin Hills Barracudas in 1999. Bill Volckening of the Barracudas received the Fitness Award in 2000 for his promotion of the February Fitness Challenge. In 2000 rules for fitness events changed due to insurance requirements and only registered USMS swimmers could participate. While USMS no longer sponsors the even, the Tualatin Hills Baracuda have continued running this national and international postal fitness event every year since, except for 2021 when pools closed due to the COVID pandemic. This year marks it's 33rd year and I have participated in all of them. It is motivating for the cold month of February and I love their Fitness Frog T-shirts!!!!

It is not too late to participate and anyone 18 and older can, USMS members and non-members alike. These days you enter your yardage online and you have 7 days after swimming to record your totals. The cost is \$15 to register. T-shirts are extra. The link to the event is below.
